PURPOSE

IMPLEMENTATION

- The *Mount Waverley North Primary School Digital Technology and Internet Acceptable Usage Agreement* will act as the operating standards for the use of learning technologies in the school community.
- Students will be encouraged to use ICT in an environment characterised by cooperation and collaboration, as well as individual pursuit.
- Greater access to learning technologies will be facilitated to students to enhance the delivery of programs across all learning areas;
- Appropriate software, hardware and applications will be accessible to enhance the delivery of learning across all domains.
- Students will develop publishing and research skills using internet facilities and encouraged to develop the skill of critical analysis in judging the quality and reliability of information available.
- Cyber safety and cyber bullying will be addressed across the school through the implementation of the eSmart program to create an awareness of safety issues associated with using the internet, social media and mobile devices
